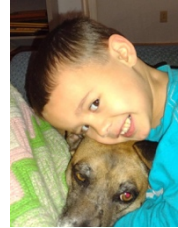

Helping Hands Needed

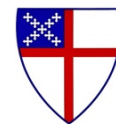
To keep our church running smoothly we always need helping hands to share the work. Listed are some ways you can join in:
