WIDENING OF SEVEN LAKES DRIVE PRESENTS CONCERNS

Kim Doolittle continues to serve as our liaison with the State as the widening of Seven Lakes Drive affects our church. An offer from the State to compensate ST.MM for the loss of a portion of our parking lot has been made and the Vestry has voted to accept the offer.

Kim presented the settlement offer to the Diocese Standing Committee on Thursday, August 18, 2022. The acceptance remains to be approved by the Diocese.

Vestry members have expressed their appreciation to Kim for his leadership in obtaining a favorable settlement. Information as to when and how the Church will be affected by the Highway 211 widening project will be made known soon, along with plans for its impact on ST. MM.

VESTRY COMMITTEE REPORTS

Fellowship Event: A lakeside social will be held at Sequoia Point in Seven Lakes North on Friday, October 14, from 5:30 to 8:00 p.m. Unlike last year, this will be a fellowship event rather than a fundraiser. David will acquire two golf carts to shuttle attendees from the parking lot to the pavilion.

Fellowship Brunches: Sunday brunches will continue on a regular basis, but not necessarily monthly. Linda Sapp will assist with planning the brunches while Andrea is involved with the challenges of moving. They are seeking venues that provide a pleasant, but not too costly experience. The next fellowship brunch will be held on Sunday, September 18, at a venue to be announced.

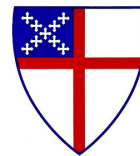
