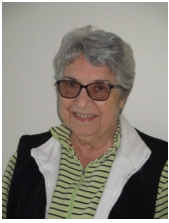

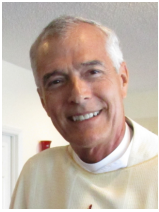

Reflections from Psalm 90

In Psalm 90, we're invited to see our lives not just in the present but as a whole—to ask God to help us “number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom” (v. 12). This understanding of how short life is should motivate us for making the most of every opportunity each day presents.

When I worked as a hospice chaplain, one of my primary goals was to help people see that each day and each moment was, in fact, sacred, regardless of how futile and frustrating life might be towards its end. Yet even for healthy people, tedious chores and routines can cause us to lose perspective. That is why we need this instruction that Moses, the Man of God (see Psalm 90's title), gives us as he calls us to pray, “May the favor of the Lord our God be upon us, and establish the work of our hands” (v. 17).

This prayer is answered when God gives us his wisdom and direction. (See Proverbs 3:5-6) It also occurs as we ask God to fill us with his love as we go about our daily activities. Then little things, simple and mundane things, will be meaningful because they are filled with love -- love for God and love for the people we serve.



Hard Work Pays Off

Linda Sapp's hard work as a gardener has not gone unnoticed. Her beautiful landscaping and gardens (including a butterfly garden) at their home in Pinewild gained notice from the local garden club and earned a recommendation to be featured in the May 2023 issue of *Our State Magazine*. Interfaith Thanksgiving Service Resumes

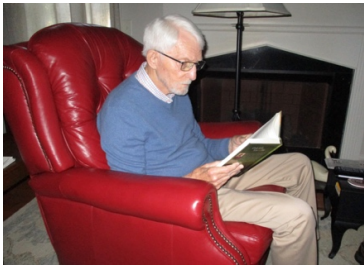
After missing the community interfaith worship for the past two years due to Covid, plans are underway to resume this Interfaith Thanksgiving Service.
